After numerous meetings between the partners and a series of tests conducted in schools, the final version of the game is finally **available online** in all the languages of the partnership. Parents and teachers can now access the project website, download the PDF version of the game, print the cards and have fun with the children. What began as a creative idea to help students better understand the issue of food waste has turned into a comprehensive educational tool, ready for use in the classroom. The game was developed in **English** and then translated into **Italian**, **Dutch**, **Greek**, **Slovenian and Romanian**.
